LA LA LAND LOCATIONS: the Best to Visit in Los Angeles

On February 26, 2017, the 89th Oscar Award ceremony, the film *La La Land* won six awards, including the Best Actress, Best Director, Best Original Song, Best Original Score, Best Cinematography and Best Production Design, becoming the biggest winner of the night, although it ran into the awkward situation where the presenters accidentally presented *La La Land* as the Best Picture while "*Moonlight*" was the true winner and later realized they read from a wrong card. The musical *La La Land* has become "a love letter" to the city, Los Angeles, making its tour business so popular that all the shooting locations are crowded with tourists. Here are three scenic settings you cannot miss if you will travel there.

Judge Harry Pregerson Interchange

La La Land's opening scene is a six-minute dance number to the song *Another Day of Sun* that plays out L. A.'s bad traffic. It's also where the film's heroes struggling actress Mia (Emma Stone) and jazz pianist Sebastian (Ryan Gosling), first meet each other—though in road rage incident. The scene is said to have been filmed over two hot days between the carpool lanes of the 105 (Century) and 110 (Harbor) freeways in south L. A.

Jar, a modern American chop house, Central L. A.

Jar is the old styled modern restaurant where Mia abandons her boyfriend, Greg, by walking out on a double date. Opened in 2001, this restaurant has featured in TV series such as *Ray Donovan* and *Modern Family* as well as 2009 Paul Rudd romantic comedy *I Love You, Man*. Well-known for its steak, Jar has been ranked among city's best restaurants by local food critics. Shortly after Mia leaves the restaurant with loud music, she walks north on Harper Avenue.

The Blind Donkey, Long Beach

The bar is the setting of Sebastian's jazz club at the end of the film—where Mia and Sebastian have their final bittersweet date. In real life, expect whiskey, wine and beer instead of jazz. Also in Long Beach is the nearby setting of Mia's pink apartment, shown earlier in the film. Built in 1928 in Spanish colonial style, Rose Towers (1728E. 3rd St., Long Beach) is a 20-unit complex that was repaired about a decade ago in a project praised by Angeles Conservancy.

My excitement died down when I learned that I was going to Germany. It would be my first visit to Europe, and I had been hoping for France or England. Why Germany? The language is harsh and unpleasant and there aren't any tourist attractions like France's Louvre or England's Buckingham Palace. I begged my parents to reconsider, but before I knew it, we were boarding our flight to Munich.

We stayed in Garmisch Partekirchen in southern Germany, a famous ski resort, at a hotel. The houses and roads somehow looked old-fashioned, as if they had popped out of a Middle Ages scene. In January, the snow-white scenery was breathtaking. Every morning we were served a satisfying breakfast buffet in German style. Whenever we ate, we were provided with delicious local food like sausage, roast chicken and homemade bread. I have never been keen to try new types of food because of my critical nature, but on this trip I enjoyed so much that I was always first to clean my plate.

The German people I met and talked with were friendly, even though they probably didn't often see Asian-Americans. Once when my family went out for dinner, we were sitting at a large table when an older couple sat at our table, also. Later I learned that it is perfectly normal for groups to sit together if there is room.

I learnt that German is a beautiful and often misunderstood language. Since the trip, I have studied German for three years and learnt more about the language and culture. I became much more interested in world culture as well as the history of America. I began to appreciate and respect the various cultures and differing beliefs of others, beliefs that seemed strange to me at first.

The travel has different meanings for different people, but I travel to leave my prejudiced thoughts at home and consider things I thought I knew from a different way and with an open mind.

Chinese cuisine(烹饪) is widely known and enjoyed in all four corners of the world. Who could not admit to longing for a favorite Chinese dish? But there is one interesting concept concerning Chinese food which is almost unheard of in the West—the ancient custom of “tonic food.”

Tonic food is food which is consumed to improve one's well-being, and stave off sickness, particularly at times when one is more likely to suffer from illness. For instance, it was once the custom for new mothers to eat a sesame (芝麻) oil hot pot every day for the first month after giving birth. It was believed that this dish would benefit the muscles, reduce pain, improve circulation, stimulate sweating, and warm the body.

In fact, these Chinese beliefs are similar to Western theories of health, although each takes a different path toward the very same goal. Western medicine actually recommends some of the exact same ingredients that make up the chicken hot pot dish. Sesame oil has been found to promote contraction of the womb while providing lots of calories, and chicken meat is particularly high in protein. Any Western doctor should be happy to suggest such a Chinese dish after childbirth.

The elderly, weak, and young can also benefit greatly from tonic foods, especially during the winter. Some foods, such as goat meat and spinach(菠菜), are seen as “hot,” while others, such as Chinese cabbage and radish, are seen as “cold.” One should be careful not to eat too much of either “hot” or “cold” food. However, how much “hot” or “cold” food one should eat depends on the time of the year, how the food is prepared and the individual's health.

The concept of tonic food is far from losing credibility, either with Westerners or researchers of modern medicine. For example, up until two years ago, tonic foods were added to the meals served at some famous hospitals abroad, especially the tonic foods with Chinese herbal medicines, such as wolfberry fruit(枸杞子), either added to fruit tea or as a beneficial addition to a diet, which attract people, such as over-worked office staff, in need of a modest pick-me-up.

There is evidence showing that many dangerous diseases such as malaria, Zika virus and yellow fever are spread by mosquitoes, which are considered as a troublesome and even dangerous insect in the world.





Recently, researchers from Britain and Japan discovered how mosquitoes fly. This knowledge, they say, help find ways to stop mosquitoes from spreading diseases in the future. Mosquito wings are small and have an uncommon shape. Because of this, it is hard to believe that they are able to fly. So, how is their flight possible?

The team of scientists from Britain and Japan solved the mystery. They used high - speed cameras and computer images to understand the mechanics of how the insect moves its wings to stay in the air. Researchers at the University of Oxford took images of mosquito wing movements. They set up eight super-high speed cameras that take 10,000 images each second.

The cameras let the researchers see that the mosquito's wings move 800 times each second. That is four times as fast as many insects of a similar size. Mosquitoes fly by moving their wings in several different directions. The thin top edges of their wings move forward first and then they change direction and move down. The movement looks almost as if the wings are drawing a lying down number eight.

The research team believes the mosquitoes' wing movements could help inventors design new flying devices. Walker says that existing unmanned flying devices do not work very well outside because wind can affect their flight. "Insects, on the other hand, deal really, really well with even quite windy conditions. So understanding how they can do this is going to be advantageous to us in the future."
