John McDouall Stuart was born in Scotland on 7 September 1815 and educated in Edinburgh at the Scottish Naval and Military Academy. After arriving in South Australia in 1839, he found employment with an *outback* (内地的) survey party. He enjoyed the life and became a skilled bushman. In August 1844 he joined Charles Sturt on his eighteen-month exploration. They travelled through inhospitable outback country where Broken Hill is now and on to Sturt's Stony Desert. Stuart came to understand the geography of the country as he drew maps of the expedition (探险). He saw the damaging effect of survey and food shortages on explorers. Like other explorers he learned the hard way about the dangers of the tough central Australian environment. He found out how to survive and be sensible in planning an expedition.

For the next twelve years Stuart worked as a surveyor at Port Lincoln in South Australia. He wanted to continue exploring but he lacked the money. Then in 1858 William Finke, a sponsor in South Australia, agreed to finance a trip to look for suitable grazing (放牧) land beyond Lake Torrens. The party went to Coober Pedy, turned south and then west. Their horses were unable to walk normally because of injuries and they were almost out of food and water when they reached Streaky Bay. He had discovered over 100,000 square kilometers of land suitable for grazing sheep. Over 2,500 square kilometers of the newly opened up country was made available for his use.

Financed again by friends, he set out in April 1859 on a second journey. As he travelled north he mapped an 800-kilometre track that had enough water to be used as a permanent route northwards. On his next trip he surveyed new cattle grazing land and found traces of gold in the Davenport Range.

Australians would be banned from buying cigarettes until age 21 under a new cancer fighting plan developed by billionaire businessman Andrew Forrest.

Mr Forrest and his wife Nicola are leading a major campaign to convince federal and state governments to raise the legal tobacco purchase age from 18 to 21.

They say this would stop young people getting addicted, save lives and save the Australian government up to \$3. 1 billion a year.

Mr Forrest and other members of the Eliminate Cancer Initiative, which the Forrests fund through their Minderoo Foundation, have already presented the plan to federal Health Minister Greg Hunt as part of an all-out attack on big tobacco.

The effort comes after Mr Forrest confirmed last week he was considering suing(起诉)big tobacco companies for the cost of smoking-related illnesses

The plan is based on a Canadian lawsuit in which three companies were ordered to pay more than \$15.6 million in damages.

Mr Forrest said tobacco companies must be held responsible for the suffering they have caused Australians. And they cannot be allowed to continue "targeting our vulnerable(易受伤害的) youth", he said.

Nearly 90 percent of adult smokers start as children. By the time they reach 21, they are hooked and become lifelong customers of big tobacco, Mr Forrest said.

"When tobacco causes many times more cost to the nation than it ever brings in profits, and creates extreme suffering before special care and death,

there is something seriously wrong with any government in the world, particularly ours, tolerating it."

Hundreds of people were gathered at the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles. Suddenly, inside the building's hallway, *dragons* were flying and breathing fire. The dragons were not real, though. They were made using a special technique called projection mapping which-casts virtual(虚拟的) pictures onto the real world. Now, it has gotten very popular in the United States. TV companies are using the technology to help to create excitement around certain events.

To create it, the artists first take hundreds of photos of an object or building. They might use lasers(激光) to measure an object exactly. Then, the computer software shows what the pictures will look like when projected onto the building or object. Next, designers produce an image that perfectly fits the

shape of the physical object. The final product is projected onto the space using bright lasers. These can cost as much as \$100,000 each.

Philippe Bergeron started a projection mapping company called Paintscaping. Bergeron said 2017 might be the company's most profitable year. Los Angeles County is a major center for talented artists. Still, projection mapping is new. It is perhaps not as popular as it could be. One reason is that it is hard to get permission from the local government for this type of show. City officials fear that the images will distract drivers on local highways.

A new company in San Francisco called Lightform is building a computer that will be able to connect with any projector. This will allow the artists to project images while drawing them. Brett Jones who runs the new company said you would be able to talk to projected images or touch the light like you would touch a smart phone screen.

Bergeron sees a bright future for projection mapping. "In the future, we are not going to be able to trust reality," he said. "We will be able to create effects that are so real that you're not going to know the difference."

Everyone becomes a little more forgetful as they get older, but men's minds decline more than women's, according to the results of worldwide survey.

Certain differences seem to be inherent in male and female brains: men are better at dealing with mental images (useful in mathematical reasoning and spatial(三维空间) skills), while women tend to excel (擅长) at recalling information from their brain's files (helpful with language skills and remembering the locations of objects).

Many studies have looked for a connection between sex and the amount of mental decline people experience as they age, but the results have been mixed.

Some studies found more age-related decline in men than in women, while others saw the opposite or even no relationship at all between sex and mental decline. Those results could be improper because the studies involved older people, and women live longer than men. The men tested are the survivors, "so they're the ones that may not have shown such cognitive(认知的) decline," said study team leader Elizabeth of the University of Warwick in England.

People surveyed completed four tasks that tested sex-related cognitive skills: matching an object to its rotated(旋转的) form, matching lines shown from the same angle, typing as many words in a particular category as possible in the given time, e. g. "objects usually colored gray", and recalling the location of objects in a line drawing. The first two were tasks at which men usually excel; the latter are typically dominated by women.

Within each age group studied, men and women performed better in their separate categories on average. And though performance declined with age for both sexes, women showed obviously less decline than men overall.

UK banks are keen to offer services to international students. However, the process of opening a bank account can take a long time and you will need to supply documents.

Many banks allow you to apply online for an account, but most recommend visiting the bank in person, as the process is quicker. You will need to take a copy of the application form, along with the necessary documents to open the account. Allow plenty of time for this, because banks are particularly busy at the beginning of term. You are advised to avoid lunchtimes.

All banks require a current passport or an EU national ID card. Applicants must also present a letter of introduction from their university. Make sure you take all the necessary original documents with you to the bank. If anything is missing, you'll have to go back again.

The banks vary in the services they provide. All banks provide a cashpoint card to allow you to obtain cash from machines 24 hours a day. *Debit cards* (借记卡) can be used for shopping and to pay bills and these are provided by all the banks. The UK uses a *chip and PIN* (芯片密码) system. You have to enter your PIN number when you want to pay by debit card.

If you have any difficulties opening a bank account, talk to the Customer Services Department at the bank. Your next port of call is the International Student Advisory Service. Above all, consider having enough finance available in case your bank account cannot be opened for up to a week or longer.
