B

Kim Ja-in was born to climb. Her parents met and fell in love in the mountains. Her mother climbed, her father climbed, both her older brothers climbed, all before she first chalked up her hands. It was only natural that she would join them. But while she was the last to start, Kim outclimbed her family a long time ago—in fact, few others can claim to have scaled the same heights.

Kim, 30, is a superstar of the sport climbing world. As a previous world champion, she faces a new challenge: the Olympics. At Tokyo 2020, sport climbing makes its debut. The competition will be run across the three disciplines of bouldering(抱石攀岩), lead and speed climbing, each with their own techniques and format. Combined results will determine medalists.

Kim has already qualified for the South Korean national team, and the team begins its Olympic qualification efforts later this summer. Lead climbing is Kim's specialty, but Tokyo 2020's format is throwing up new challenges. "I had to do speed climbing, which I've never done before," she explained. "It's been hard recently because of that."

As an ambassador for the sport, she's gone to extreme lengths to raise climbing's profile in South Korea. In 2017, Kim scaled the 555-meter Lotte World Tower in Seoul—the fifth tallest completed building in the world on live television. "I thought it would be a good way to introduce sports climbing to the public," Kim said.

After 19 years of climbing and 15 years on the professional circuit, Kim said that her love of the sport is not reliant upon medals. She just relishes the chance to stand in front of a new wall and climb it for the first time. "When I finish a climb, that sense of achievement and joy are the biggest attraction when it comes to climbing," she explained. "Climbing is everything to me."

You can count on the fact that cocoa bean planting is bad for the environment—especially for the rainforests of West Africa. That's enough to make some consumers think about giving up chocolate. But what if we could enjoy chocolate without climate guilt? In fact, we can, because when cocoa is grown sustainably, it can actually help save the world.

Cocoa beans grow on shrubs that are often planted in the open but can also grow better under large rainforest trees. Well-managed shade-grown cacao trees can store a significantly higher amount of carbon than annual crops—up to three times the amount stored by cacao trees grown in full sun. Shade-grown cacao trees are also more drought-tolerant and weed-resistant than those grown in the open. They are friendlier to wildlife, improving biodiversity.

The problem is not that cacao trees can't help the environment. The problem is that too few of them do. The reasons for this are complex, but mainly boil down to lack of resources, lack of information and insecure land tenure(保有期). Many West African cacao farmers are sharecroppers. They can't remove old, diseased trees because this would risk losing the land. They can't afford to plant new trees, either. As a result, new cacao farms are usually created by businessmen who cut down trees and create chemical-intensive(大量使用化学物品的) plantations, which both pollute and reduce biodiversity.

As the planet grows warmer and drier, though, these high-productive, full-sun cacao varieties are becoming weaker in the heat. Many small cacao farms in West Africa's cocoa belt, which supplies up to 70 percent of the world's cocoa, now suffer from low productivity. But there is hope. When cost and land tenure issues are solved, farmers are more than willing to grow cacao trees in the shade.

Trees are the most important weapons in the fight against climate change. So enjoy your chocolate—provided that it's a sustainable, shade-grown brand. In fact, buy, eat and give as much of it as you like. The world will thank you.

The government of Burkina Faso granted scientists permission to release genetically engineered mosquitoes anytime this year or next, researchers announced Wednesday. It's a key step in the broader efforts to use bioengineering to remove malaria(疟疾) in the region.

The release, which scientists are hoping to do this month, will be the first time that any genetically engineered animal is released into the wild in Africa. While these particular mosquitoes won't have any mutations (变异) related to malaria transmission, researchers are hoping their release, and the work that led up to it, will help improve the consciousness of the research and trust in the science among regulators and locals alike.

In Africa, the project's success depends on more than just the science of genetic engineering. The people who live in the areas where the mosquitoes will be released must give their permission, researchers must staff and maintain labs to work with genetically modified animals, and regulators must accept the new technology. The coming release of these mosquitoes serves as a stress test for the whole system.

These mosquitoes, unlike their "gene-drive" peers, are not intended to have a lasting impact on the insect population. They have something called a "sterile(不育的) male" mutation—none of the male mosquitoes to be released will be able to have offspring. Nearly all will be male, but less than one percent might be female—which are the only members of the species that bite. If any bite a human, they will not pass on any genetically modified material. All of the modified mosquitoes the group will release are also weaker than natural mosquitoes, so they should die off in a matter of months.

The scientists also worked hard to address questions about the science behind their efforts—including concerns about whether those "sterile males" might somehow pass on that sterile status to humans.

38 _____ It may help to explain the substantial gap in opinion between children and parents about how much screen time is acceptable. According to a survey, the amount of screen time that adults thought appropriate for children was 1.75 hours, with children believing it to be 3.34 hours.

39 _____ However, recent research suggests that instead of setting specific time limits for usage, such as a maximum of two hours per day, it's actually the nature of the screen time that matters. For instance, passively looking through social media posts is less beneficial than actively playing games, which can improve problem solving skills. A study found that "how children use the devices, not how much time they spend on them, is the strongest predictor of emotional or social problems connected with screen addiction."

Twining agrees, saying: "I'm less concerned about screen time than about the nature of the interaction around the screen. The screen should become a shared focus for interaction with the family rather than an individual activity. The screen shouldn't be an alternative to communicating
